

## **Holistic Development Approach (HDA)**




## A Brief Narration on Different Projects Implemented by Agragami in 2018-19

As an voluntary social welfare organisation, Agragami has been implementing numerous programs following a holistic development approach for sustainable development of the disadvantaged and underprivileged people of west Bengal. Most of the programs and projects are implemented with the financial assistance of the development partners and/or government agencies and private sector, while some are exclusively from its own resources. The major program of Agragami include as follows:-

#### **Mobile Medical Unit**

The Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) is a key strategy by National Health Mission (NHM)\_to facilitate access to public health care particularly to people living in remote, difficult, underserved and unreached areas. The objective of the strategy is to take healthcare to the doorsteps of population particularly rural, vulnerable and underserved areas. Agragami has been implementing the program in Saltora & Khatra of Bankua district, in Jhalda of Purulia district of West Bengal. The services are covered by 3 Vehicles (4 wheelers) to offer Medical Check-up, consultation, provision of free medicine, diagnostic and conducting medical counselling etc. The MMUs are assigned with the task of delivering primary healthcare in remote villages which included Curative, Reproductive, Diagnostic and Radiology services for one day in a week. All the MMUs currently operating is having a qualified Medical officer, Nurse, Lab-technician, Pharmacist, and X-ray technician.

## **Description of Service Provided**



#### Rogi Sahayata Kendra:

Instituting a system of disseminating necessary information to the patients and patient parties has been major concern for all Govt. health care service units veg. Primary Health Centre, Block Primary Health Centre, District Hospital, Rural Hospital etc. Purulia Agragami has been running successfully in 10 Nos. of Rogi Sahayata Kendra (RSK) in BHHCs & RH under Jhalda & Raghunathpur Subdivision and at Raghunathpur Sub-Divisional Hospital Purulia under NRHM & Govt. of west Bengal by providing easy

access to information about the services available in the health facility to all clients and stakeholders, to disseminate all patients related information to patients and relatives on a real time basis so that they may access the available services fully and without delay, Decreasing the communication gap has created lesser strain in Doctors- patients relationship and move towards better work environment with the system constraints and ever increasing demand resulting to grater rise in patients satisfaction.

#### The main activities are as follows;

- Easier access of patients to hospital services and reduced harassment
- Increased patient satisfaction
- Reduced incidence of conflicts with patient parties
- Provide accurate information about the services available in the health facility to all clients and stakeholders.
- Disseminate all patient related information to patients and relatives on a real-time basis so that they may access the available services fully and without delay.
- Assist the service providers of the health facility by appropriately guiding the patients / visitors

#### Revised National Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP):

Tuberculosis(TB) is a major medical anmd social problem in India and 1.96 million new cases are found annually. Eve4ry year 3,30,000 people dies due to TB which means that over 1000 people die because of TB every day. Under Revised Tuberculosis Control Program (RNTCP), Agragami has been addressing the control of spreading Tuberculosis(TB) within the community. And with that li9ne Agragami has been implementing i)ACSM at community level,ii) ACSM for youth iii) Improving TB control in Urban Slum iv)Sputum collection & transportation and v) Contact tracing under RNTCP covering a population of 931363 nos. within 19 Municipal Wards and 48 Gram Panchayats of Jaypur, Sonamukhi, Indus, Patrasayer, Kotulpur block and in Radhanagar G.P and Bishnupur Municipality of Bishnupur Health district.

## **LINK WORKERS SCHEME (LWS):**

AGRAGAMI has been implementing Link Workers Scheme (LWS) project for High Risk Group Population & their spouses in partnership with West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society (WBSAP&CS), H&FW Deptt. Govt. Of West Bengal & NACO since 2016. The project is being implemented at 100 villages in 15 blocks of Paschim Medinipore District—covering 350189 population.

The main objective of the programme is to halt and reverse the epidemic by integrating programme for prevention, care, support and to address the issues like: Condom Promotion (Promotion/Distribution of Condoms), Social Marketing, Develop Inter-personal Behaviour Changes Communication, Community Mobilization and IEC activities, health camp organisation for Referral and linkage service, Linkage to Integrated Counselling and Testing Centers (ICTC), Creation of enabling environment (Advocacy for Enabling Environment ) etc.

Under this Project AGRAGAMI has taken different program activities during this year such as:-

#### **Condom Promotion**

The intervention has planned for promotion of correct and consistent use of condom among the target population groups by making condom 3A i.e. accessibility, availability & affordability. For increasing access to the condom, free

condoms has supplied by the project. Besides, the CLWs & LVs are also supplying the free condom as per their estimated demand regularly during counselling sessions.

#### **Behaviour Change Communication**

Proper communication is one of the most important strategies to fight against HIV/AIDS. Information, Education and Communication is a process that informs, motivates and helps people to adopt and maintain healthy practices and life skills. To change the behaviour of the community AGRAGAMI developed IEC materials containing messages relating to HIV/AIDS which is considered as one of the key events of the project to upgrade their understanding level. The materials are being distributed by the PE and outreach staffs during One to One session, One to Group Session, Focus Group discussion, Community events, Health camps, World AIDS Day, Mid- Media activities (Magic Show) etc. for de-stigmatize of HIV/AIDS as prevention is the most effective strategy for control of HIV/AIDS.

#### **Community Mobilization**

This is aimed at building community ownership of the LWS objectives. Committees like Hotspot level committees, DIC management committee are formed for planning, building the capacity of the groups to assume ownership of the programme.


#### Menstrual Hygiene Management Program

Agragami is implementing Menstrual Hygiene Management Program" a CSR Initiative of COAL India Ltd. with Nirman Foundation since July, 2017 in 50 nos.

Schools, selected by District Education Dept., in eight blocks of Purulia district. The Project includes different program activities like:, Develop Inter-personal Behaviour Changes Communication, Community Mobilization and IEC activities, Social Marketing and Establishment of Napkin Outlet at Schools, Sanitary Napkin Promotion, distribution for easy access of Napkins in their need. Regular monitoring and maintenance conducted in those schools where Vending machines & Incinerators installed have been under this program. Adolescent Intervention Program

'Adolescent Intervention Program', empowering adolescents through their rights, has been designed by UNICEF with the support of Purulia District Administration to improve the adolescent's life in the age group of 10 to 19 years. The convergent strategy on adolescent is aims to achieve better outcomes in the area of adolescent's development, Health & Nutrition, Education, Protection & Empowerment through information and skill development. AGRAGAMI is implementing the project at Purulia-II block and Jhalda Municipality of Purulia district since 2015.

# Construction of Soak pit, Drain & Platform under Nirmal Bharat Sachya Bharat (Gramin)

Hand pump fitted Tube wells are the major drinking water sources in rural areas of Purulia having no proper drainage system for disposal of wastewater resulting contamination of ground water sources. And to combat the situation Agragami implemented "Const. of Soak pit. Surface Drain & Platform in 110 nos. of tube wells for Liquid Waste Management from spot Source including Training & IEC" a CSR initiative of PHE Deptt. with COAL India Ltd' & SIPL, in different GPs under Neturia Block of Purulia district.

## National Rural Drinking Water Quality Monitoring & Surveillance Program

Agragami is implementing the Project at 131 villages covering a population of 1, 37,143nos. in Jhalda-I Block under Purulia district since 2007. The Laboratory is run with financial and Technical support of Public Health Engineering Dept. Govt. Of West Bengal, this was initially setup with assistance of UNICEF under Fluoride Mitigation Program.

#### **CRECHE SERVICES:-**

2 nos.Creche Centers are running at Kulajanga and Jargo village under Jhalda-I Block of Purulia district since 1997, catering to fifty (50) nos. of children of 2-5 years of working and ailing mother, who are provided with Balwadi education training, regular health Checkup with medical care & immunization and supplementary nutrition, with support from Social Welfare Deptt. Govt. Of West Bengal

#### OTHER WELFARE ACTIVITIES

Apart from above activities, Purulia District Agragami Mahila O Sisu Mangal Samiti (AGRAGAMI) Agragami, undertakes various welfare activities through a well structured program in line with the current activities. The major other welfare activities are as follows:-

## International Women's Day

International Women's Day was celebrated on 8th March 2019at Jhalda & Porulia -II in a befitting manner. The celebration included a series of programs like workshop, Drama competition, Sit & Draw, Dance, Debate and quiz competition. A large numbers of KANYASREE Clubs, SABALA Groups so formed from our end participated in the events. CDPO, IC Jhalda Police station, SI of Schools, BMOH, Chairman Jhalda Municipality, and many other dignitaries attended the program.

## National Safe Motherhood Day

'Safe Motherhood Day'was observed this year on 11<sup>th</sup> April,2018 in the Meeting Hall of Jhalda Municipality & Purulia-II block of Purulia district, West Bengal with an aim to spread awareness about safe motherhood and curb taboos associated with Child birth etc. Theme of the Program was "Amplify Women's Voice for Quality, Equity & Dignity for Improved Maternity Health" A large number of Adolescent Girls, SHG Members, Health & ICDS Workers participated from the surrounding areas. BMOH, CDPO, BPHN of the concerned blocks facilitated the program.Quiz competition, Drama, Video Show, Speeches were performed. Booklets and other learning materials were distributed among the participants.

## Menstrual Hygiene Management Day

"It's Time for Action" .

Menstrual Hygiene Day is observed every year on May 28th with an aim to spread awareness about menstrual hygiene and curb taboos associated with menstruation. The day intends to enable women and girls around the world to

achieve their full potential without menstruation becoming a hindrance. Using a hygienic method of menstrual protection is important for women's health and personal hygiene. According to NFHS-4, women age 15-24 were asked what method or methods they use for menstrual protection, if anything. In India, 42 percent use sanitary napkins, 62 percent use cloth, and 16 percent use locally prepared napkins. Overall, 58 percent of women in this age group use a hygienic method of menstrual protection. There is a dire need in our country for making conditions better for women.

So on 28th May, 2018 Agragami conducted awareness program at Jhalda and Purulia-II of Purulia district of West Bengal.

## Observance of National Girl Child Day

Quiz competition, dance competition, speech competition on the topic of 'child marriage' is the some of the events of the programs conducted by Agragami on 24.01.2019 at Jhalda, Purulia. More than 100 young girls participated in the programs and made it successful. Several issues related to adolescent Health, Nutrition, child marriage and Education were also discussed in the Program. AGRAGAMI has organised Child Rights Day an awareness program about "Protection of Child Rights", with a focus on Early Marriage. The programme took place Municipal Community Hall, Jhalda. Several issues related to Child Marriage were discussed.
